Membership in the Northwest Cape Coral Neighborhood Association is strictly voluntary.



Our successes and accomplishments

 Passage of a City Ordinance for Construction Trash Containment to reduce the amount of blowing construction debris that clutters our beautiful area

- Obtained bike lanes for safer travel of our NW Cape joggers and bicyclists
- Obtained a new 7-acre neighborhood park that is currently under construction on Ceitus Parkway
- Recommended significant land use changes, including the creation of Commercial Activity Centers districts for more compatible neighborhood commercial development
- Published a New Neighbor Welcome Handbook for our new residents
- Large scale participation in the annual NW Cape spring neighborhood cleanup
- Obtained City approval to replace the outdated Ceitus Boat Lift with a permanent lock to improve boat traffic flow, while respecting the environment and wildlife

Current and future NWNA interests

- Development of a prudent plan for the widening of Burnt Store Road, including development of the adjacent land, based on a 355' right-of-way to buffer neighborhood disturbance
- Ceitus Boat Lock design and installation planning to serve our many boaters and wildlife enthusiasts in the area
- Various land use and zoning changes, creating more suitable zoning districts to protect the value of our homes by creating more compatible types of neighborhood commercial projects
- · Street paving and maintenance
- Neighborhood cleanliness and beautification
- Recreation facilities, such as additional parks, sidewalks, bike lanes, etc.
- Working closely with the City to plan our future sewer and water utility needs to effectively handle our population growth
